I WAS JUST THINKING . .

The mark of a great leader is the demands he or she makes upon his or her followers. The Italian freedom fighter, Garibaldi, offered his men only hunger and death to free Italy. Winston Churchill told the British people that he had nothing to offer them but “blood, sweat, toil, and tears” in their fight against their enemies. Jesus spoke of the necessity of total commitment - even to the point of death. He conveyed this in no uncertain terms when he said to his disciples, “You must take up your cross and follow me.”

Why was he so harsh? He knew what lay ahead – of the remaining apostles after Judas committed suicide, all but one died by execution. Only John made it through alive but he was exiled to a small island in the middle of the Mediterranean Sea.

The demands that Jesus makes upon those who would follow him are extreme. Christianity is not a Sunday morning religion. It is a hungering after God to the point of death if need be. It shakes our foundations, topples our priorities, pits us against friend and family, and makes us strangers in this world.

Someone has calculated how a typical life span of 70 years is spent. Listen to these surprising numbers:

Sleep.....	23 years.....	32.9%
Work.....	16 years.....	22.8%
TV.....	8 years.....	11.4%
Eating.....	6 years.....	8.6%
Travel.....	6 years.....	8.6%
Leisure.....	4.5 years.....	6.5%
Illness.....	4 years.....	5.7%
Dressing.....	2 years.....	2.8%
Religion.....	0.5 years.....	0.7%
Total.....	70 years.....	100%

Viewed this way we see how small a priority spiritual matters occupy in peoples’ lives. But Jesus is a demanding leader. A thousand times more demanding than any of us will ever know. He gives us the imperative command to take up a cross. Will it be a burden? At times yes. But the joy of following Jesus will overshadow its weight.
