I WAS JUST THINKING. . . by Pastor Jim

A 1973 movie that I enjoy re-watching is, Papillon. Steve McQueen plays the main character who has a butterfly tattooed on his chest. "Papillon" is French for "butterfly." The story is about the incarceration and subsequent escape from the French penal colony of French Guiana, and covers a 14 year period between 1931 and 1945.

McQueen plays the role of a criminal who was imprisoned for life for crimes against the French state. The movie portrayed the dreams he had while in prison. In one dream, he stood before a tribunal for a crime. He pleaded with the judge that he was not guilty of the crime for which he was being tried. The judge replied that he was not being tried for that crime, but for a crime that is the most heinous crime of the human race. Papillon asked what crime it was. He replied, "The crime of a wasted life." Papillon wept, "Guilty, guilty." The judge pronounced the sentence of death.

Some of us live wasted lives – caused by a lack of ambition, misappropriation of gifts and talents, or failure to appreciate the nature, character, grace, and love of God. We carry those attitudes into virtually every dimension of our lives. We do so with our use of money for the work of God's Kingdom.

In, The Living Faith, Lloyd C. Douglas tells the story of Thomas Hearne, who, "in his journey to the mouth of the Coppermine River, wrote that a few days after they had started on their expedition, a party of hostiles stole most of their supplies. His comment on the apparent misfortune was: 'The weight of our baggage being so much lightened, our next day's journey was more swift and pleasant.'

"Hearne was en route to something very interesting and important; and the loss of a few sides of bacon and a couple of bags of flour meant nothing more than an easing of the load. Had Hearne been holed up somewhere, in a cabin, resolved to spend his last days eeking out an existence, and living on capital previously collected, the loss of some of his stores by plunder would probably have worried him almost to death."

How we respond to "losing" some of our resources for God's work depends upon whether we are on the move or waiting for our last stand. Are we "wasting" away or are we moving forward in our journey of faith? I rather like what the Apostle Paul wrote and commend it to all of us to employ, even in our stewardship: "I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus."
