

DID YOU KNOW..... that we have a staffed infant and toddler nursery available for you to use during worship? Children through age 2 are welcome to come and play. There is also a curtained off corner in the nursery for those who may need some privacy which can be used for nursing or for soothing your child. Additionally, we have the TLC ministry for those who are 3 years old through Kindergarten where children may go after the Children's Lesson. The KFC program is for children in 1st - 3rd grades and leave after the Children's Lesson out the back of the sanctuary. Older children can find worksheets and coloring pages on a table in the Sanctuary near the side entrance. Any of our ushers or nursery workers will be glad to show you how to locate our nursery or children's ministries and supplies. We love having so many growing families in church!

Today is Food Bank Sunday! We are collecting non-perishable food items and paper products for the residents of VOICe (Victim Outreach Intervention Center). The *Items of the Month* are hot/cold cereals, syrup and pancake mix. All items should be un-opened and non-perishable (not requiring refrigeration or freezing, and no produce). If you have any questions, please check with a member of the Mission Committee, one of the pastors, or the office staff. Supporting local people who are struggling is just one way that CCUPC is trying to make a difference and to spread the love of God. If you forgot your donation, please drop it off at the church office Monday - Wednesday from 9:00 AM - 2:00 PM. (And a reminder that you can bring in food bank items all month long! You can place your items on the shelving unit in the greeting area.)

Christina Taylor, Nursery Coordinator, has scheduled a **"Toy Cleaning Party"** next **Sunday, November 4th** in the Infant/Toddler nursery! Now that the flu season is upon us, stay after worship and help thoroughly clean the toys that your kids play with in the nursery. And speaking of the nursery.....for the well-being of our Nursery Volunteers (and those using the nursery), if your child is ill, please refrain from taking them to the nurseries. Thank you for your consideration for all who are involved.
