

DID YOU KNOW..... that we have a staffed infant and toddler nursery available for you to use during worship? Children through age 2 are welcome to come and play. There is also a curtained off corner in the nursery for those who may need some privacy which can be used for nursing or for soothing your child. Additionally, we have the TLC ministry for those who are 3 years old through Kindergarten where children may go after the Children's Lesson. The KFC program is for children in 1st - 3rd grades and leave after the Children's Lesson out the back of the sanctuary. Older children can find worksheets and coloring pages on a table in the Sanctuary near the side entrance. Any of our ushers or nursery workers will be glad to show you how to locate our nursery or children's ministries and supplies. We love having so many growing families in church!

I WAS JUST THINKING. . . by Pastor Jim

Reading from the end of the Gospel narratives to the beginning, one would have expected that Jesus would have acted in a more profound, dramatic, or spectacular way to unveil His glory and begin His public ministry. Why a common event such as a wedding rather than a dramatic healing? And why does John choose to give us a glimpse at the interaction between Jesus and his mother? Precious little is said about her apart from the birth narratives and the vigil at the cross. John gives us a glimpse at how a mother and son relate. But it does raise some questions.

One author comments: “Just what was Mary thinking? Did she really think that her divinely conceived son had come into this world to do no more than help people save face after committing this or that social faux pas? ‘Woman, it is not yet my time’ Jesus said in reply to Mary's request. But he could just have plausibly said, ‘Woman, this is not my gig. Woman, I have not come into this world full of grace and truth to lubricate the skids of social conviviality.’

“What was Mary thinking? Then, what was the evangelist John thinking? When it comes to soaring rhetoric and high-flying promises, it's tough to beat John 1. From the bracing poetry of the Prologue to John the Baptist's prediction that Jesus is ‘The Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world,’ we have been set up in this fourth gospel to expect . . . well, to expect the WORLD from Jesus. Instead what we get is this homely little story about a wedding party gone bad where Jesus swoops in to save the day by providing a wine cellar's worth of intoxicating beverages to wedding guests who already had a few under their belts as it was.

“‘From His fullness we have received one blessing after another’ John wrote in chapter 1:16. But not long after saying that, John shows us blessing in the form of one full-to-the-brim wine glass after another. ‘We have seen His glory’ John wrote in 1:14, but then immediately says that Jesus’ first public revelation of this same glory came after the disciples sampled this fine pinot noir in Cana.”
