There is also a curtained off corner in the nursery for those who may need some privacy which can be used for nursing or for soothing your child. Additionally, we have the TLC ministry for those who are 3 years old through Kindergarten where children may go after the Children's Lesson. The KFC program is for children in 1st - 3rd grades and leave after the Children's Lesson out the back of the sanctuary. Older children can find worksheets and coloring pages on a table in the Sanctuary near the side entrance. Any of our ushers or nursery workers will be glad to show you how to locate our nursery or children's ministries and supplies. We love having so many growing families in church!

The class meets for 7 more weeks during the Sunday School hour from 9:00 - 9:45 AM in the Pastor's Study. I WAS JUST THINKING. . . by Pastor Dena

How many of you have ever been really hungry? You know the feeling, that "I could eat anything that isn't nailed down" rumble in your stomach? Fortunately, it is rare that we don't have access to some sort of food when we want it – whether we stop by a grocery or convenience store, run through the closest drive through, or cook something ourselves, no one can deny that most people sitting here this morning have seemingly endless options when it comes to food.

Unfortunately, many in the world don't have nearly the same resources. No one really knows for sure how many people are malnourished, but the statistic most frequently cited is that of the United Nations Food and Agriculture Organization, which measures undernutrition. For the third year in a row, there has been a rise in world hunger. The absolute number of undernourished people, i.e. those facing chronic food deprivation, has increased to nearly 821 million in 2017, from around 804 million in 2016. These are levels similar to almost a decade ago. Persistent instability in conflict-ridden regions, adverse climate events in many regions of the world, and economic slowdowns that have affected more peaceful regions and worsened the food security, all help to explain this deteriorating situation. However, even in developed countries like our own, hunger exists. One statistic reported that 40 million people struggle with hunger in the United States, including more than 12 million children. Our own community is not exempt.

Although CCUPC alone cannot eliminate world hunger, we are working to make a difference. Today is Food Bank Sunday when we collect unperishable food and household items for those in need. These items are then sent to VOICE, where women and their families who are fleeing difficult situations, often with very little resources, can get food. CCUPC holds this collection on the 4th Sunday of every month, although you can bring your donations and stock our shelves at any time. Donations that come in early in the month are useful for when an individual or family stops by the church requesting food assistance. If we have donations "in stock," we often let people take what they need.

Even donations of just a few items can make a big difference to those struggling with food insecurity. Hygiene items are tremendously useful as well - toothpaste, deodorant, shampoo, and personal care products. Many of us have been blessed with an abundance of choices and access to many different options. Please consider making donations to the food bank an ongoing part of your personal mission giving.
