DID YOU KNOW..... that we have a staffed infant and toddler nursery available for you to use during worship? Children through age 2 are welcome to come and play. There is also a curtained off corner in the nursery for those who may need some privacy which can be used for nursing or for soothing your child. Additionally, we have the TLC ministry for those who are 3 years old through Kindergarten where children may go after the Children’s Lesson. The KFC program is for children in 1st - 3rd grades and leave after the Children’s Lesson out the back of the sanctuary. Older children can find worksheets and coloring pages on a table in the Sanctuary near the side entrance. Any of our ushers or nursery workers will be glad to show you how to locate our nursery or children’s ministries and supplies. We love having so many growing families in church!

I WAS JUST THINKING... by Pastor Dena

This week our congregation continues to focus on those who are living with food insecurity. Today we will collect our annual **“Souper Bowl of Caring”** Offering. Each year, proceeds of this offering are to be donated locally to the organization of our choice that is fighting hunger. Hunger is a very real problem in our world, and even in our community. And hunger isn't just about an uncomfortable growling tummy! Hunger affects every part of the body. These effects can last a lifetime.

Brain: Healthy - A healthy brain uses 20% of your body's energy. That energy comes from food.

Hungry - Hunger starves the brain. The result? Malnourished kids fall behind in school because they can't concentrate. This puts them at a disadvantage for other educational and employment opportunities, often perpetuating the cycle of hunger and poverty.

Heart: Healthy - A healthy heart pumps a steady supply of blood throughout the body.

Hungry - An undernourished heart shrinks. Literally. So it has to work harder to pump blood, which the body can't make enough of.

Vital Organs: Healthy - The liver & kidneys filter out toxins & waste, while the immune system fends off disease.

Hungry - Dangerous toxins build up as the liver & kidneys fail. A weakened immune system crumbles in the face of killer diseases.

Skin & Bones: Healthy - Healthy skin is like armor, shielding the body from infection. Healthy bones get bigger & stronger as a child grows.

Hungry - Skin cracks, becoming a gateway for infection. Bones stop growing - which is why hungry kids often end up being small for their age, also known as stunting.

These are not just problems for developing nations. These are problems faced by children and adults here in our own community. The **“Souper Bowl of Caring”** is trying to help. Our church is collecting today on behalf of the **“Souper Bowl of Caring.”** All of our donations will go to the Lighthouse Foundation. Each week the Lighthouse provides food for over 200 families who are able to get fresh produce, canned goods, meat, frozen food, and fresh bakery items. Over \$1,000,000 of food is distributed each year. Please consider contributing to help get food into the hands of those who need it.
